The City of Brevard Fire Department provides a highly trained, professional emergency service to the citizens of our coverage area. This service includes fire suppression, motor vehicle collisions, rescue, fire cause and determination, hazardous material incident mitigation, fire and life safety education, fire prevention activities, and car seat installation.

MISSION STATEMENT

The City of Brevard Fire Department is committed to protecting the people, property, and environment within our community. We will accomplish our mission through prevention, education, fire suppression, hazard mitigation, and other related emergency and non-emergency services. We will effectively and efficiently utilize all the necessary resources at our command to provide this service for the citizens of our community.

BUDGET OBJECTIVES - FY 2018-2019

- First priority is lowering response time, which is critical for the health and safety of our citizens and firefighters, by adding a third firefighter to the Monday through Friday Day staff.
- Increase the number of NC Certified Firefighters, Technical Rescuers, and Emergency Medical Technicians within the department through training and recruitment.
- Increase departmental media exposure and develop cooperative relationships with the different media representatives.
- We want to research and develop a medical first responder program for the citizens of the Brevard Fire District.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

GOALS ACHIEVED - FY 2017-2018

- In 2017 the Brevard Fire Department responded to 1051 incidents.
- The Fire Department lowered its ISO rating from a 4 to a 3 in the City Limits. This
 is a substantial insurance savings to the commercial structures in the Brevard Fire
 District.
- The Fire Department maintained it ISO 5 rating in the contracted County area.
- Received grant funding for new SCBAs which saved the Brevard Fire District over \$300,000.00.
- The members of the Brevard Fire Department completed over 6,500 hours of training in over 200 individual training sessions. Adding several more certified members.





 Every fire hydrant (529) was flowed and maintained. The 19 water points and dry hydrants in Sylvan Valley 2 were also visited and maintained. There were 750 preincident surveys completed in 2017.



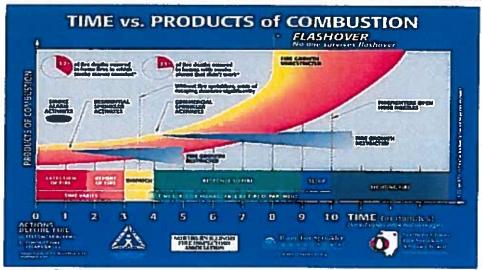




- In 2017 our fire prevention and education efforts reached 4,000 children in Transylvania County. We had several more of the local home school groups visit the fire station for tours and education. Staff also provided fire safety education and fire extinguisher training for local businesses and groups.
- The Brevard Fire Department is also the only certified car seat inspection/installer for Brevard and Transylvania County. We installed and inspected over 450 car seats in 2017. We are the only certified agency or department in Transylvania County that provides an educational resource for caregivers with their car seats. This service is available to any Transylvania County resident or visitor.







Deployment of apparatus:

The response times shown are the average time that it takes for a fire truck to arrive at a citizen's residence or a business. By adding more staffing and fire stations, these times could be lowered.

A second station is needed to reduce response times. The station would satisfy the North Carolina Response Rating Schedule need of an engine every 1.5 miles, a ladder/service every 2.5 miles of built-upon property in the fire district. A second station within the Brevard Fire District, on the North Side of town, could possibly lower the ISO rating to a Class 1 or 2. This would provide an additional insurance savings to commercial structures with the fire district.

A station in the Wilson Road/Williamson Creek area will reduce response times to a large portion of the contracted County area which includes Wilson Road, Williamson Creek, Glenn Cannon, Barclay Road, Rich Mountain Road, and East Main Street. The station will reduce insurance rates for homeowners in Sylvan Habitat/Glenn Cannon who are considered unprotected (10 rating) because it is more than 6 miles from the station. This area has an assessed value of \$30,853,080 with 57 properties and 37 structures. The 6-mile area will come within 5 miles and go from a 9 to a 5 insurance rating. This area has an assessed value of \$79,847,160 with 364 properties and 249 structures.

The reduced insurance rating will far outweigh what a small fire tax increase will incur. The chart from the NCRRS shows that a \$100,000 house pays \$585/year at Class 10 and that drops to \$320/year at Class 5 which we are within 5 miles of a station.

Points to consider

No Fire Department funding problem has been identified, there has been no group or community complaints of too high Fire Tax that we are aware of. — if it ain't broke, don't fix it.

Flat tax WILL significantly increase the tax burden on the property owners in 3 districts. Lake Toxaway, Sylvan Valley district 2, and Connestee.

Newer, smaller departments all struggle, every department in the county has grown over time, no one went from a 1 truck, 1 bay building to a 6 truck 5 bay building overnight. Each department grew as their community, needs, and resources grew.

There are alternatives funds available if the county would use them to help the smaller/newer departments such as PILT monies, and using General fund monies to match grants (5% - 50% match)

Flat tax is NOT the accepted standard across the state, only 8% are currently using this method. A significant percentage of those counties still are having problems with unequal department funding and inadequate department funding. (Person County, Surry County, others mentioned)

All county fire departments have significantly lowered their ISO rating, saving homeowners a lot of money on their insurance. Are their any other county departments or contracted organizations that can say they have SAVED homeowners money?
