Clarity on BCTDA's Financial Support of the 2020 Chow Chow Culinary Festival

You may have heard that the Buncombe County Tourism Development Authority (BCTDA) voted on October 30 to support the second annual Chow Chow nonprofit culinary event with a sponsorship of \$100,000, using ExploreAsheville.com advertising revenue set aside for community events.

Chow Chow attracted national talent and recognition, hosted 3,200 attendees, stimulated \$2 million in local business spending, generated \$136,000 in local tax revenue, and provided a \$53,000 contribution to MANNA Food Bank. Chow Chow was enjoyed by locals (66%) as well as visitors. The event achieved an impressive \$1.3 million worth of earned coverage in national media outlets and an amazing 2.8 million social media impressions.

Approval of the \$100,000 sponsorship for 2020 Chow Chow was opposed by a member of the BCTDA board who raised legitimate questions. We commend this board member for exercising his oversight responsibility and we regret the lack of clarity in the preparation for the meeting and the explanations that were provided during the meeting.

We would like to take this opportunity to provide additional information, including the full report of event fund transactions for three years, which was requested following the meeting.

As a public entity, the BCTDA board of directors and staff take seriously our commitment to transparency and clarity (efforts praised last spring by Mountain Xpress). — LINK TO https://mountainx.com/opinion/xpress-calls-for-greater-transparency-in-local-government/. And, as a reminder, we provide full information, including all financials, on the BCTDA website, AshevilleCVB.com [LIVE LINK], both in advance and following board meetings. We welcome community comments and questions.

Background on the Establishment of the Festival and Cultural Event Grant Program

In March 2014, the BCTDA approved the integration of paid advertising on ExploreAsheville.com, which generated a source of revenue not subject to occupancy tax legislative mandates. This earned income has been allocated to the support and sustainability of local events, as a form of tourism development that also helps to sustain community culture.

At its inception, the Earned Revenue Fund was expected to generate about \$50,000 per year for community events. As shown below, revenue has exceeded those projections, enabling the funding of local festivals and cultural events at a higher level.

This revenue is reported on the monthly financial statements on the Balance Sheet and on the Income Statement.

Transitions in Accounting Systems

Questions arose at the October BCTDA board meeting about accounting procedures for the Earned Revenue Fund, which is understandable, given that Explore Asheville has operated under three different accounting systems in the last four years. Annual audits have demonstrated rigor in financial practices and the accuracy of financial statements during these transitions.

- **FY 2014-15 through FY 2016-17:** The Asheville CVB was a department of the Asheville Area Chamber of Commerce and was under a combined Chamber/Buncombe County Finance accounting structure known as Lawson.
- FY 2017-18 from July 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018: Explore Asheville became an independent entity on July 1, 2017 and functioned solely under Buncombe County Finance's Lawson accounting structure for the first nine months of the fiscal year.
- **FY 2017-18 April 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018**: Buncombe County Finance switched from Lawson to a system called Workday mid-year on April 1, 2018, so the last three months of the fiscal year were under the new Workday accounting structure.
- **FY 2018-19 to present:** Full fiscal year budgets are administered using the Buncombe County Finance/Workday accounting structure.

The transitions from one accounting system to another, and then another, were reported to the board with explanations of challenges associated with these changes.

An Overview of the Earned Income Fund's Actual Revenues and Expenditures

The first page of the accounting document [LINK TO DOCUMENT] includes the following summary of the Fund's actual revenues and expenditures by fiscal year through FY 2018-19, followed by a line item detail by fiscal year.

The \$176,223 highlighted balance in the summary represents FY 2018-19's ending balance for Explore Asheville's last fiscal year, closed June 30, 2019. The year-end financial statements will be presented with the audit at the November meeting of the BCTDA. The FY 20 column shows what was *budgeted* for fiscal year 2020.

The year-end financial statements have been audited and will be presented to the BCTDA at the November board meeting by Clifton Larson Allen LLP. These financial statements were not available when the vote in question took place. However, when compared to the ending balance arrived at in the summary above (\$176,223), the audited financial statements and summary matched exactly.

Based on this thorough review, and the summary numbers aligning with the audited financial statements, we are confident that the Earned Revenue Fund balance numbers are correct.

"I get a sense sometimes among some people....that the way to make change is to be as judgmental as possible about other people and that is enough. That is not activism, that is not bringing about change. If all you are doing is casting stones, you are probably not going to get that far."

I believe that in Asheville, we can avoid the trap of tribalism, and work together. We....we can be better than this....and in the end accomplish more.

Editorial Response – v2

There's been much to celebrate in our community in recent weeks, which the *Citizen Times* has covered in its pages.

- The <u>Asheville Art Museum</u> reopened with great fanfare; a nonprofit, state-of-the-art, downtown landmark and the culmination of a dream to create the Southeast's premier art museum.
- The <u>Center for Craft</u>, the country's leading nonprofit organization that identifies and convenes craft makers, curators and researchers, launched its National Craft Innovation Hub, a gateway to the other cultural assets found downtown within a few short blocks of one another.
- Across town, the <u>Bob Lewis Ballpark</u> run by the nonprofit Enka Youth Sports
 Organization completed installation of an extensive new lighting system for its seven
 ballfields part of the Enka Recreation Destination, which will connect existing
 greenways and include the Enka Heritage Trail.
- An eclectic variety of successful local festivals and cultural events took place, including the <u>Blue Ridge Pride Festival</u>, the <u>Appalachian Folk Festival</u>, the <u>Eliada Corn Maze</u>, <u>CiderFest NC</u>, the <u>Craft Fair of the Southern Highlands</u>, and the inaugural <u>Chow Chow culinary festival</u>.

What do all of these cultural projects, events, facilities, infrastructure, and attractions have in common? They are meant to be enjoyed by local residents as well as visitors.

And, along with dozens of other entities, have received financial support in the millions of dollars from the Buncombe County Tourism Development Authority.

This support has come either from grants through the Tourism Product Development Fund (TPDF) or from the TDA's festivals, cultural events, and major events sponsorship program.

Seeing coverage about these projects and events in the *Citizen Times* made it all the more ironic to also read a recent <u>editorial by Ami Worthen</u> in the paper on November 17. In that piece, Ms. Worthen accused the BCTDA of being an institution that "does more harm than good," saying "our community would be better off without it."

Tell that to folks associated with the 39 community projects and organizations that have received a total of \$44 million from the TPDF paid with revenue that came exclusively from the occupancy taxes paid by visitors — not by local residents, not by local government. Until establishment of the Dogwood Trust, the TPDF was the largest source of funding for these types of projects in Western North Carolina.

Explain it to the thousands of attendees at the dozens of festivals and cultural events that have received sponsorship dollars from the BCTDA, funded exclusively by earned revenue from paid advertising on the ExploreAsheville.com website – not by local residents, not by local government.

Ask the 27,000 local people whose jobs depend on tourism – your neighbors and mine – the value of the BCTDA, a public authority created for the public good to strengthen the local economy, creating jobs, generating tax revenue, and funding facilities and infrastructure.

Or talk to the 1,200 local businesses – mostly small, independent ventures – about how they'd feel if the marketing they get at no cost to them, at no cost to local residents, at no cost to local government, were to end. And whether they could survive on the patronage of local residents alone.

To put it more personally, look at your own budget as a local resident and factor in what your family would have to give up in order to pay the additional \$1,800 in local taxes that would be needed to cover the deficit left by visitors no longer here to spend money at local businesses, generating state and local sales taxes to pay for services you depend on.

Think about your favorite local restaurants, breweries, attractions, outfitters, and other independent businesses. Decide which ones you want to see go out of business. Is it a comedy tour bus? A music venue? A gift shop, gallery, river-tubing business, coffee shop? And which festivals and cultural events that you and your family love to attend will cease to exist?

The BCTDA brings customers to local businesses at no charge to them or to local taxpayers. Our creative community of artists, crafters, musicians (including Ms. Worthen herself) have all benefited from visitors who come to enjoy what we get to enjoy every day.

Abolish the TDA, as Ms. Worthen suggests, and there are consequences that she fails to acknowledge.

Instead, we invite you to join us in supporting the Tourism Management & Investment Plan (TMIP), the community engagement process announced by the BCTDA more than a year ago to better manage tourism and consider revisions to the occupancy tax. The goal is to plan investments for the next decade, while maintaining the character and integrity of the region.

Let's work together to manage tourism in a manner that sustains and enhances quality of life in Buncombe County.

A perspective on Tourism, and the role of the TDA

I would like to provide a counter point to Ami Worthen's recent opinion editorial on tourism and the TDA. I won't bother to challenge the many factual inaccuracies here, since an opinion piece is, as defined by the dictionary, a "judgement on something, not necessarily based on fact or knowledge". Clearly the definition fits this article.

I understand the narrative, popular in some circles, of blaming tourism and the TDA for a variety of social ills, some of which are part of the social fabric of every growing city. However, Asheville's rapid growth is a product of multiple geographic, social and demographic factors, only one of which is tourism.

My hope here is to provide a different perspective on the TDA and tourism, and build a great willingness to have us work together on solutions.

Asheville has been a tourism destination for over a century. In 1983 hoteliers formed the TDA and to voluntarily collecting the occupancy tax from their visitors and help grow the economy. This has helped local businesses of all kinds, grow and weather multiple economic downturns over the past 35 year. Now over 1250 businesses and 27,000 local workers are part of this hospitality partnership. And we acknowledge that the growth of tourism has produced both benefits and challenges.

Tourism is a key economic driver for our economy. Beyond hotels, restaurants, and microbreweries (and the locals they employ), tourism support the work of artists, retail shops, I.T., Real Estate, plumbers, carpenters, electricians, financial advisors, lawyers, bankers, massage therapist, hairdressers, printers, marketing firms.....the list goes on.

Included in this list are many local writers, including Ami, who in the past has been paid by the ExploreAsheville.com to write articles promoting tourism in Asheville.

Most of the small business here do not have the resources to market themselves beyond a local customer base. They could not survive on their own without the resources, expertise and free training provided by the TDA / CVB to help bring them customers.

I believe Ami's article demonstrates a naivete about destination management, economic development and what is require for a business to survive in a competitive economy. Over 27,000 locals depend on tourism for their livelihood. These professionals work hard every day to create memorable personal experience, and a positive business image for Asheville. Visitors and potential businesses alike visit us from around the world. These entrepreneurs are your friends and neighbors, and need the free support that the TDA and CVB provide.

This article also fails to acknowledge the \$44 Mil of spending the TDA has provided for community development projects, as well as hundreds of thousands of dollars provided to local charities by successful tourism businesses.

In her article, Ami laments that "the TDA is quick to rattle off numbers about revenue generated by tourism". This is true! These number could also be known as "facts"....and "facts are stubborn things" (John Adams).

I know that with the busy lives we all lead, the average citizen is unaware of the many positive initiatives taking place at many levels of business and government in Asheville. The city has hired the Urban Land Institute to advise on urban planning. There are multiple new initiatives and funding sources for affordable housing. The county has new programs to address childhood education, aging and many other issues.

The TDA is in the midst of a yearlong community engagement process with PGAV consultants (CVB/TMIP) to build a sustainable tourism plan and consider adding flexibility to the occupancy tax.

I believe If you asked a 1000 people what they wanted from Asheville in the future, the answers would be remarkably more similar than different.

The challenges we face will be better solved if we work together. And for better or worse everyone is doing what they believe is best. To scapegoat any segment of our community diminishes us all.

The desire of everyone to live in a place of acceptance and inclusion is what makes Asheville special, however imperfectly we live out that ethic at any time. Succumbing to tribalism will diminish the Asheville we want, rather than fix it.

A recent quote by Barack Obama highlights the perils of the "call out culture", and of being "politically woke"

"I get a sense sometimes among some people....that the way to make change is to be as judgmental as possible about other people and that is enough. That is not activism, that is not bringing about change. If all you are doing is casting stones, you are probably not going to get that far."

I believe that in a community the size of Asheville, we can get far, if we avoid the trap of tribalism, and work together....we can be better than this.....and in the end accomplish more.

Gary Froeba – Editorial in response to Ami Worthen op-ed on Nov. 17, 2019

There's been much to celebrate in our community in recent weeks, which the *Citizen Times* has covered in its pages.

- The <u>Asheville Art Museum</u> reopened with great fanfare; a nonprofit, state-of-the-art, downtown landmark and the culmination of a dream to create the Southeast's premier art museum.
- The <u>Center for Craft</u>, the country's leading nonprofit organization that identifies and convenes craft makers, curators and researchers, launched its National Craft Innovation Hub, a gateway to the other cultural assets found downtown within a few short blocks of one another.
- Across town, the <u>Bob Lewis Ballpark</u> run by the nonprofit Enka Youth Sports
 Organization completed installation of an extensive new lighting system for its seven
 ballfields part of the Enka Recreation Destination, which will connect existing
 greenways and include the Enka Heritage Trail.
- An eclectic variety of successful local festivals and cultural events took place, including the <u>Blue Ridge Pride Festival</u>, the <u>Appalachian Folk Festival</u>, the <u>Eliada Corn Maze</u>, <u>CiderFest NC</u>, the <u>Craft Fair of the Southern Highlands</u>, and the inaugural <u>Chow Chow culinary festival</u>.

What do these cultural projects, events, facilities, infrastructure, and attractions have in common? They are meant to be enjoyed by local residents as well as visitors.

And, along with dozens of other entities, have received financial support in the millions of dollars from the Buncombe County Tourism Development Authority.

This support has come either from grants through the Tourism Product Development Fund (TPDF) or from the BCTDA's festivals, cultural events, and major events sponsorship program.

Seeing coverage about these projects and events in the *Citizen Times* made it all the more ironic to also read a recent <u>editorial by Ami Worthen</u> in the paper on November 17. In that piece, Ms. Worthen accused the BCTDA of being an institution that "does more harm than good," saying "our community would be better off without it."

Tell that to folks associated with the 39 community projects and organizations that have received a total of \$44 million from the TPDF the largest source of funding for these types of projects in Western North Carolina until establishment of the Dogwood Trust.

Those were grants paid with revenue that came from the occupancy taxes paid exclusively by visitors. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government. By visitors.

Explain it to the thousands of attendees at the dozens of festivals and cultural events that have received sponsorship dollars from the BCTDA.

Those dollars came revenue earned from paid advertising on the ExploreAsheville.com website. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government.

Ask the 18,000 local people who work in tourism-related businesses – your neighbors and mine – the value of the BCTDA, a public authority created for the public good to strengthen the local economy, creating jobs, generating tax revenue, and funding facilities and infrastructure.

Funding for the work of the BCTDA comes from visitors. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government.

Funding comes from visitors. The tax singles out hotels and other lodging properties and is paid by people who stay overnight in Buncombe County. It is then invested for the betterment of our community and all of us who live here. It is administered by volunteers – people who live here, who have families here -- appointed by the City and the County.

Talk to the 1,200 local businesses – mostly small, independent ventures – about how they'd feel if the marketing they get at no cost to them, at no cost to you, at no cost to government, were to end. Ask whether they could survive on the patronage of local residents alone.

These businesses and our creative community of artists, crafters, musicians (including Ms. Worthen herself) have all benefited from visitors who come to enjoy what we get to enjoy every day. And that's not coming out of your pocket.

Abolish the TDA, as Ms. Worthen suggests, and there are consequences that she fails to acknowledge.

To put it more personally, think about your favorite local restaurants, breweries, attractions, outfitters, and other independent businesses. Decide which ones you want to see go out of business. Is it a comedy tour bus? A music venue? A gift shop, gallery, river-tubing business, cafe? And which of your family's beloved festivals and cultural events will cease to exist?

We invite you consider the facts about the benefits of tourism. And join us in supporting the Tourism Management & Investment Plan (TMIP), the community engagement process announced by the BCTDA a year ago to better manage tourism and consider revisions to the occupancy tax. The goal is to plan investments for the next decade, while maintaining the character and integrity of the region.

Let's work together to manage tourism in a manner that sustains and enhances quality of life in Buncombe County.

You may have seen recent calls to abolish the lodging tax, dismantle the BCTDA and defund the free tourism and marketing support programs that benefit local, independent businesses and the people who live here.

Here is a **link** to the anti-tourism opinion piece that ran last week in the Asheville Citizen-Times. This opinion piece is a narrow view of the importance of tourism to our region's economic vitality—an annual impact of \$3.1 billion—and the depth of our community's collective 36-year investment made possible through tourism with an active long-range plan to enhance and protect our special mountain home.

As locals who love our community, we are honored to serve you as the marketing arm connecting people who travel to your businesses.

Destination promotion is funded 100 percent by the tax on commercial lodging in Buncombe County paid by people who visit. All tourism-related businesses (and the 18,346 people working in tourism jobs in our community) benefit directly or indirectly from the marketing, sales and community engagement efforts of Explore Asheville as guided by the BCTDA board of community members.

We ask you, what would you lose if the lodging tax was repealed?

• Would you miss a dedicated team of media pros who secure national news stories for the Asheville area and businesses who may not be able to afford their own public relations? The PR team leverages longstanding relationships in the saturated news landscape to help inspire and guide 2.3 billion media impressions in national and key markets. Beyond securing major accolades that keep Asheville top of mind, the team shares thousands of local partner news items and stories every year through targeted outreach. The team works to broaden the perspective of journalists on assignment, opening opportunities for under-

the-radar news and locally-owned independent businesses and illuminating local figures, little-known histories and emerging cultural assets.

- How would it impact your business to lose the destination
 advertising based on data science that communicates
 Asheville's authentic spirit and motivates travel? Every dollar spent
 on advertising returns \$43 in local expenditures and \$3 in sales tax
 revenues. Explore Asheville's advertising investment will drive nearly \$500
 million in visitor spending that sustains local, independent businesses, with
 special emphasis on slower post-holiday winter months and other periods
 of need.
- Would you miss the power of the ExploreAsheville.com website and its 5 million annual user sessions and downstream traffic to your free listings, events and news? This online repository—optimized through content and social media strategies—gathers collective inspiration from our entire community...from deep insights and little-known histories to practical travel tips and listings. So far this year, ExploreAsheville.com generated 1.45 million clicks to local partner websites. Beyond the website, an Explore Asheville partnership with Google optimized the way Asheville-area businesses appear across the entire Google search ecosystem with 500+ new visual assets that were viewed more than 2 million times and included training for local businesses.
- Would the Asheville area feel the impact of losing \$14.7 million in annual group meetings and motorcoach business each year? The group sales team proactively cultivate interest from 13,000 meeting planners and group travel buyers around the country. Explore Asheville's support of sporting events like SoCon, Fed Cup, Haute Route and Spartan races brings in millions in attendee spending to local businesses and adds lifestyle offerings for locals.

- What would replace the free professional networking,
 engagement programs and marketing trainings for industry
 partners? Explore Asheville's community engagement arm offers partners
 a network of industry resources, professional education and access to
 national speakers that broaden perspectives and boost collaboration across

The 2018 grant cycle recipients included LEAF Global Arts Center, National Craft Innovation Hub, YMI Cultural Center, NC Arboretum and the African-American Heritage Museum at Stephens-Lee Recreation Center. Since 2001, funding has also supported at a total of 39 projects including the new Asheville Art Museum, Pack Square Park, African-American Heritage Trail Project, The Wortham Center, WNC Farmers Market and a range of City and County projects including parks, greenways and River Arts District infrastructure.
- Which beloved festivals and events are at risk without the operational support provided by BCTDA? Making use of advertising revenue from ExploreAsheville.com, the fund helps preserve cultural identity with nearly \$622,000 in event support since it launched in 2016. This year's recipients include Asheville Fringe Arts Festival, Blue Ridge Pride, Hola Community Arts, Independence Day Celebration, Asheville Percussion Festival, ASAP Farm Tour, Chow Chow, Montford Neighborhood Festival and Black Mountain College + Art Center's {Re}Happening.

Future Investment with a Citizen Voice: The community grant program is undergoing an important evolution with a public process. The Tourism Management & Investment Plan to Develop Community Assets (TMIP) is a long-range community investment strategy with a public voice and a new process that provides a structure for public input on long-term projects to manage tourism

impacts and sustain and enhance the quality of our area. TMIP will create a blueprint guided by public input for infrastructure and capital projects that can be funded by tourism tax dollars.

We ask you to reflect on what you love about this community, what BCTDA and Explore Asheville marketing support means to your business and what you want to see moving forward.

BCTDA is focused on a values-based approach to tourism and community—supporting makers and creators; enhancing the places we love with the infrastructure we need; pulling forward history and fortifying community through support of important culture initiatives; and working to protect and enhance the specialness of our mountain home.

If you would like to lend your voice to the conversation, there are many ways to get involved. Write a letter to the editor. Use the power of social media by responding with facts and your personal experience. Speak up at candidate forums, panels and debates and participate by asking questions or providing facts. And, be a visible member of the tourism community by talking to family, friends and neighbors.

Stop in and talk with us if you have questions or want to have a conversation. This place is precious to all of us, and we all want to do right by Asheville.

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Gary Froeba - Editorial in response to Ami Worthen op-ed on Nov. 17, 2019

There's been much to celebrate in our community in recent weeks, which the *Citizen Times* has covered in its pages.

- The <u>Asheville Art Museum</u> reopened with great fanfare; a nonprofit, state-of-the-art, downtown landmark and the culmination of a dream to create the Southeast's premier art museum.
- The <u>Center for Craft</u>, the country's leading nonprofit organization that identifies and convenes craft makers, curators and researchers, launched its National Craft Innovation Hub, a gateway to the other cultural assets found downtown within a few short blocks of one another.
- Across town, the <u>Bob Lewis Ballpark</u> run by the nonprofit Enka Youth Sports Organization completed installation of an extensive new lighting system for its seven ballfields part of the Enka Recreation Destination, which will connect existing greenways and include the Enka Heritage Trail.
- An eclectic variety of successful local festivals and cultural events took place, including the <u>Blue Ridge Pride Festival</u>, the <u>Appalachian Folk Festival</u>, the <u>Eliada Corn Maze</u>, <u>CiderFest NC</u>, the <u>Craft Fair of the Southern Highlands</u>, and the inaugural <u>Chow Chow culinary festival</u>.

What do these cultural projects, events, facilities, infrastructure, and attractions have in common? They are meant to be enjoyed by local residents as well as visitors.

And, along with dozens of other entities, have received financial support in the millions of dollars from the Buncombe County Tourism Development Authority.

This support has come either from grants through the Tourism Product Development Fund (TPDF) or from the BCTDA's festivals, cultural events, and major events sponsorship program.

Seeing coverage about these projects and events in the *Citizen Times* made it all the more ironic to also read a recent <u>editorial by Ami Worthen</u> in the paper on November 17. In that piece, Ms. Worthen accused the BCTDA of being an institution that "does more harm than good," saying "our community would be better off without it."

Tell that to folks associated with the 39 community projects and organizations that have received a total of \$44 million from the TPDF the largest source of funding for these types of projects in Western North Carolina until establishment of the Dogwood Trust.

Those were grants paid with revenue that came from the occupancy taxes paid exclusively by visitors. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government. By visitors.

Explain it to the thousands of attendees at the dozens of festivals and cultural events that have received sponsorship dollars from the BCTDA.

Those dollars came revenue earned from paid advertising on the ExploreAsheville.com website. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government.

Ask the 18,000 local people who work in tourism-related businesses – your neighbors and mine – the value of the BCTDA, a public authority created for the public good to strengthen the local economy, creating jobs, generating tax revenue, and funding facilities and infrastructure.

Funding for the work of the BCTDA comes from visitors. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government.

Funding comes from visitors. The tax singles out hotels and other lodging properties and is paid by people who stay overnight in Buncombe County. It is then invested for the betterment of our community and all of us who live here. It is administered by volunteers – people who live here, who have families here -- appointed by the City and the County.

Talk to the 1,200 local businesses – mostly small, independent ventures – about how they'd feel if the marketing they get at no cost to them, at no cost to you, at no cost to government, were to end. Ask whether they could survive on the patronage of local residents alone.

These businesses and our creative community of artists, crafters, musicians (including Ms. Worthen herself) have all benefited from visitors who come to enjoy what we get to enjoy every day. And that's not coming out of your pocket.

Abolish the TDA, as Ms. Worthen suggests, and there are consequences that she fails to acknowledge.

To put it more personally, think about your favorite local restaurants, breweries, attractions, outfitters, and other independent businesses. Decide which ones you want to see go out of business. Is it a comedy tour bus? A music venue? A gift shop, gallery, river-tubing business, cafe? And which of your family's beloved festivals and cultural events will cease to exist?

We invite you consider the facts about the benefits of tourism. And join us in supporting the Tourism Management & Investment Plan (TMIP), the community engagement process announced by the BCTDA a year ago to better manage tourism and consider revisions to the occupancy tax. The goal is to plan investments for the next decade, while maintaining the character and integrity of the region.

Let's work together to manage tourism in a manner that sustains and enhances quality of life in Buncombe County.





Gary Froeba – Editorial in response to Ami Worthen op-ed on Nov. 17, 2019

Please consider posting this online ASAP since it is in response to an editorial that has been online since November 15.

There's been much to celebrate in our community in recent weeks, which the Citizen Times has covered in its pages.

- The <u>Asheville Art Museum</u> reopened with great fanfare; a nonprofit, state-of-the-art, downtown landmark and the culmination of a dream to create the Southeast's premier art museum.
- The <u>Center for Craft</u>, the country's leading nonprofit organization that identifies and convenes craft
 makers, curators and researchers, launched its National Craft Innovation Hub, a gateway to the other
 cultural assets found downtown within a few short blocks of one another.

- Across town, the <u>Bob Lewis Ballpark</u> run by the nonprofit Enka Youth Sports Organization completed installation of an extensive new lighting system for its seven ballfields part of the Enka Recreation Destination, which will connect existing greenways and include the Enka Heritage Trail.
- An eclectic variety of successful local festivals and cultural events took place, including the <u>Blue Ridge Pride Festival</u>, the <u>Appalachian Folk Festival</u>, the <u>Eliada Corn Maze</u>, <u>CiderFest NC</u>, the <u>Craft Fair of the Southern Highlands</u>, and the inaugural <u>Chow Chow</u> culinary festival.

What do these cultural projects, events, facilities, infrastructure, and attractions have in common? They are meant to be enjoyed by local residents as well as visitors.

And, along with dozens of other entities, have received financial support in the millions of dollars from the Buncombe County Tourism Development Authority.

This support has come either from grants through the Tourism Product Development Fund (TPDF) or from the BCTDA's festivals, cultural events, and major events sponsorship program.

Seeing coverage about these projects and events in the *Citizen Times* made it all the more ironic to also read a recent editorial by Ami Worthen in the paper on November 17. In that piece, Ms. Worthen accused the BCTDA of being an institution that "does more harm than good," saying "our community would be better off without it."

Tell that to folks associated with the 39 community projects and organizations that have received a total of \$44 million from the TPDF the largest source of funding for these types of projects in Western North Carolina until establishment of the Dogwood Trust.

Those were grants paid with revenue that came from the occupancy taxes paid exclusively by visitors. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government. By visitors.

Explain it to the thousands of attendees at the dozens of festivals and cultural events that have received sponsorship dollars from the BCTDA.

Those dollars came revenue earned from paid advertising on the ExploreAsheville.com website. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government.

Ask the 18,000 local people who work in tourism-related businesses – your neighbors and mine – the value of the BCTDA, a public authority created for the public good to strengthen the local economy, creating jobs, generating tax revenue, and funding facilities and infrastructure.

Funding for the work of the BCTDA comes from visitors. Not out of your pocket. Not by local government.

Funding comes from visitors. The tax singles out hotels and other lodging properties and is paid by people who stay overnight in Buncombe County. It is then invested for the betterment of our community and all of us who live here. It is administered by volunteers – people who live here, who have families here -- appointed by the City and the County.

Talk to the 1,200 local businesses – mostly small, independent ventures – about how they'd feel if the marketing they get at no cost to them, at no cost to you, at no cost to government, were to end. Ask whether they could survive on the patronage of local residents alone.

These businesses and our creative community of artists, crafters, musicians (including Ms. Worthen herself) have all benefited from visitors who come to enjoy what we get to enjoy every day. And that's not coming out of your pocket.

Abolish the TDA, as Ms. Worthen suggests, and there are consequences that she fails to acknowledge.

To put it more personally, think about your favorite local restaurants, breweries, attractions, outfitters, and other independent businesses. Decide which ones you want to see go out of business. Is it a comedy tour bus? A music venue? A gift shop, gallery, river-tubing business, cafe? And which of your family's beloved festivals and cultural events will cease to exist?

We invite you consider the facts about the benefits of tourism. And join us in supporting the Tourism Management & Investment Plan (TMIP), the community engagement process announced by the BCTDA a year ago to better manage tourism and consider revisions to the occupancy tax. The goal is to plan investments for the next decade, while maintaining the character and integrity of the region.

Let's work together to manage tourism in a manner that sustains and enhances quality of life in Buncombe County.




