Hello Sylva and Jackson County,

Below you will find factual information from Jackson County Law Enforcement about Saturday's protest and counter-protest events. These protests are over the Confederate monument in Sylva. Both of these protests are scheduled to take place from 1:00pm until 3:00pm, in Sylva NC. These protests will take place at two different locations.

Reconcile Sylva Protest:

Originally a group titled "Reconcile Sylva" planned a protest to show their support for re-locating the Confederate monument. This group has obtained a permit from the town for this event. Their group is scheduled to gather at Bridge Park from 1:00pm until 3:00pm. The group also plans to do a March around the downtown area to show their support for their cause.

Counter-protesters will not be allowed in this area during the times listed.

Jackson County Unity

Coalition Counter Protest:

There is also a counter-protest being planned by a group titled, the Jackson County Unity Coalition to show support leaving the monument in place. This counter-protest is set to take place in the parking lot of old historic courthouse on this same date and time.

For the safety of all involved, protesters and counter-protesters will not be allowed to share the same space.

Jackson County Law Enforcement asks for each group to simply protest with their groups and avoid creating unsafe situations.

It should be noted by all, that the fountain area and the entirety of the old courthouse hill and steps will be closed to everyone. Nobody will be allowed in that area.

For safety purposes, traffic will be diverted around our downtown area during the march portion of this event. We will re-open traffic just as soon as possible.

"This protest event puts your local law enforcement in a tough spot, we want both sides to be seen and heard on Saturday. Although we may not all agree on this issue, we are one community and we can't allow any injuries or property damage." - Chris Hatton, Chief of Police

A letter to the community from the Chief

Hello Sylva,

As you all know, we had a large protest and counter-protest event here in our town on Saturday. Our goal was achieved. At the end of the day, we didn't have any injuries, no property was damaged and we didn't have to make any arrests. This event and the way law enforcement handled it has generated a lot of questions. My purpose today is to try and give you some information to help you understand our tactics during this event.

It's no secret that the Sylva Police Department only has 14 officers and we aren't equipped to handle these large protest events without the help of our sheriff's office, fire department and other public safety partners. These events seriously stretch our town's resources, but it is not an option to use that as an excuse for anything less than optimal public safety. We must keep everyone safe. From the public safety standpoint, this event utilized approximately 80 people, that includes public safety, public works staff and volunteers helping with logistics. We are so fortunate to have such great partners.

Many citizens noticed that our tactics, traffic patterns and overall response for this weekend's protest seemed more visible and "beefed-up" than prior events. This is true and for good reason. Some of the things you may have noticed on Saturday were changes to the protest routes, road closures, location of safety barriers, more roadways blocked by large vehicles and the completely blocked off "safety zone" on W. Main Street. Another change was the length of time traffic was closed off to the protest route / downtown.

Why the extra precautions? Prior to this event, our law enforcement learned of a potential threat to our property and possibly our safety. While I can't go into the specific details, we received information that an out-of-town group was planning to attend our event with criminal intentions. This group was not part of our local protestors or counter-protestors. During the week prior, this group was collecting a "bail fund for the Sylva event" on social media.

We worked together with our federal and state law enforcement partners to learn about this group and their tactics at other events. We took advisement from these organizations and our local criminal justice resources to devise a plan that would keep everyone safe at our event.

Did it work? All information learned post-event indicates that this group was in our town on Saturday, but left before the event was over. During the event, social media chatter from the group indicated that

our town was "locked down and saturated by cops." After the event, we debriefed the officers involved and complied all information learned. We've also had many discussions with citizens in Sylva about things they observed on Saturday. While we may never know for sure, but all evidence points to the fact that we were able to prevent a potentially dangerous situation in our town. This is a huge win for us all and I'm really proud of our team.

We realize these street closures had a serious impact on our downtown businesses, we simply could not sacrifice your safety. We certainly recognize that our businesses are having a very hard year, and we are working on new ideas that will help them in the future. To our business owners, please know that we only closed down the traffic for as long as we had to.

As stated, this protest event was a real challenge for our resources, and the fact that it took so much cooperation between agencies and individuals may help you to understand that it wasn't without complications and temporary failures. We had some unexpected issues with traffic flow early on in the day. The Dillsboro bridge closure created some problems for us in a couple locations. We made some adjustments to the traffic route and were able to get traffic flowing smoothly.

We also had an issue early on with parking for the protest event at Bridge Park. Our safety plan included closing down Railroad Avenue to make room for protestors and keep them safe from any possible vehicle traffic. The traffic pattern was set up incorrectly at first and it caused the people attending the Reconcile Sylva event to have to park elsewhere. Officers blocked off Railroad Avenue for safety as planned, but didn't allow vehicles close enough to park their cars in the adjacent parking lots. As soon as this problem was discovered, we immediately opened the roadway to allow cars onto that section of Railroad Avenue.

It's disheartening, but many people have made the assumption that this was on purpose by our officers. This is a completely false assumption. This parking problem was nothing more than a oversight while setting up that road closure. A mistake that came from officers trying to keep the protestors safe. The Sylva Police Department has a history of being nothing short of 100% responsive and helpful when it comes to working with protest organizers and protecting our citizen's right to assemble and protest. Thank you to those of you that gave us the benefit of the doubt.

In conclusion, I'm humbled by our community partners for their contributions to this weekend's successful event. If you interact with anybody from any of these groups, please be sure to thank them. Below you will find a list of involved agencies:

For the safety of all involved, protesters and counter-protesters will not be allowed to share the same space.

Jackson County Law Enforcement asks for each group to simply protest with their groups and avoid creating unsafe situations.

It should be noted by all, that the fountain area and the entirety of the old courthouse hill and steps will be closed to everyone. Nobody will be allowed in that area.

For safety purposes, traffic will be diverted around our downtown area during the march portion of this event. We will re-open traffic just as soon as possible

This protest event puts your local law enforcement in a tough spot, we want both sides to be seen and heard on Saturday Although we may not all agree on this issue, we are one community and we can't allow any injuries or property damage' - Chris Hatton, Chief of Police

Per N.C.G.S. 14-277.2, no dangerous weapons will be allowed at either protest or march locations.
