Over the past five years, 32% of the victims of violent crime (rape, robbery, aggravated assault, and homicide) have been Black. Of those, half have been female. Despite comprising only 6% of Asheville's population, Black females are 16% of all violent crime victims. The disparity is even greater when considering 1 in every 5 domestic violence victim is a Black female (20%).

Of all the crimes reported to APD from 2016-2020, there were 45,439 victims. 10% of those victims identified as Black females (4,539 victims). During that same time period, Black females comprised 15% of UCR Part I violent crimes (524 victims), 6% of UCR Part I property crimes (1,061 victims), and 12% of all other crimes (2,438 victims). In terms of violent crime, Black males are victimized at a higher rate than Black females. However, in terms of all other crimes, Black females comprise a higher percentage of the victims than Black males. Overall, Black residents comprise 32% of all violent crime victims, 12% of all property crime victims, and 19% of all other crimes.

So far for 2021, the victim disparity has decreased with only 27% of violent crime victims identifying as Black (13.6% - female; 13.3% - male). 10% of property crime victims as Black and 16% of victims of all other crimes. While Black males and Black females comprise roughly equal parts of the violent and property crime victims, Black females make up a larger percentage of victims of other crimes, which is due primarily to simple assaults.
